#### TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATION: FUTURE SOLUTIONS TO EXTEND ACCESS TO CARE



#### DR SHELLY BATRA

→ Shelly Batra is a gynaecologist-obstetrician and President and co-founder of Operation ASHA. She has been selected as Social Entrepreneur of the Year and Schwab Fellow by the World Economic Forum. She is also an Ashoka Changemaker, a blogger for the Huffington Post and a best-selling Penguin author. Her commitment and expertise have resulted in invitations to talk at major Ivy League universities and other faculties, to deliver the Hippocrates Society Women in Medicine lecture at Wellesley College and to give a webinar in paediatric tuberculosis for the CORE Group. She has also given TEDx lectures for the World Bank and the Institute of Management in India. She is highly in demand as a speaker on many national and international platforms such as the Social Enterprise Summit, the Geneva Health Forum and events organised by the World Economic Forum. She is an expert in fundraising and donor relations. Shelly Batra has received numerous awards, including the Exemplary Contribution Award from the Indian Medical Association for her selfless work with the poor and disadvantaged. Operation Asha was a laureate in 2018 of the Global South eHealth Observatory of the Fondation Pierre Fabre.



#### DR MEHDI BENCHOUFI

→ Chief Medical Officer in Epidemiology at the Hôtel-Dieu Hospital, he works mainly at the intersection between medicine and new technologies, with a particular focus on artificial intelligence, blockchain and their applications to clinical research. He also coordinates Open Science programmes, such as echOpen, a miniature, low-cost, open source ultrasound which can be connected to a smartphone, and Epidemium, a collaborative research programme into big data and onco-epidemiology. He is also an associate of mathematics and a software developer. He is a member of the APHP Digital Council a member of the Scientific Council of the APHP Medical Research Foundation member of the working group of the Global South eHealth Observatory of the Fondation Pierre Fabre.



#### PROF CHEICK OUMAR BAGAYOKO

→ A Doctor of Medicine, Cheick Oumar Bagayoko is also a specialist in Information and Communication Technologies. He obtained a master's degree in Biomedical and Health Informatics from the René Descartes University of Paris V, a professional Master's in Health Information Systems Expertise and Engineering from the University of the Mediterranean Aix-Marseille II and a doctorate in Public Health and Clinical Research, with a Medical Informatics option. An Associate Professor of Medical Informatics, he is also director of the Centre of Expertise and Research in Telemedicine and E-Health (CERTES). Cheick Oumar Bagayoko has solid experience of coordinating, implementing and managing large-scale projects, notably through several expertise assignments in Mali, Africa and Europe as well as through his role as general coordinator of the Telemedicine Network in Francophone Africa (RAFT). The author of several scientific publications, Cheick Oumar Bagayoko is a member of the steering committee of the Global South eHealth Observatory. Since 2019, he has supervised the joint decree course in eHealth, Healthcare Innovation and Practices, resulting from a partnership between the Universities of Bamako, Dakar, Abidjan and the Fondation Pierre Fabre. He is director of the Centre for Innovation and Digital Health created by the University of Technical Sciences and Technologies in Bamako and the Fondation Pierre Fabre.



#### PROF OUSMANE FAYE

→ Tenured Professor of Dermatology. Head of the Bamako Dermatology Hospital. Outgoing Vice Dean of the Bamako Faculty of Medicine and Odontostomatology. Head of Dermatology Education at the Faculty of Medicine. Director of the Dermatology Department at the National Centre for Disease Control. Professor Ousmane Faye is the force behind an ambitious teledermatology programme introduced in 2015 with the support of the Fondation Pierre Fabre, one that is now being extended throughout Mali. This programme is also being replicated in Togo and Mauritania.

HOW CAN NEGLECTED POPULATIONS AND DISEASES BE INCORPORATED INTO THE GLOBAL HEALTH AGENDA?



### PROF DAPA DIALLO

→ A doctor trained in haematology, medical biology, good clinical and laboratory practice, biomedical ethics, in France and the USA.

He is Professor of Haematology at the Faculty of Medicine and Odontostomatology of the University of Science and Technology of Bamako (USTTB) in Mali; Head of the Department of Haematology-Medical Oncology at the Point G University Hospital in Bamako, Mali; Managing Director of the Centre for Sickle Cell Disease Research and Control (CRLD) in Bamako, Mali, since 2010.

Author or co-author of more than 140 scientific publications in peer-reviewed scientific journals. Member of several learned societies, scientific committees and boards of directors. President of the Malian Society of Haematology and Oncology (So.Ma.Ho). Winner of the AUF "EL FASI" Scientific Award in 2008. Founding member of the Academy of Sciences of Mali. Foreign correspondent member of the French Academy of Medicine. Knight of the Malian Order of Merit in Healthcare. Awarded the Medal of Honour in Healthcare by the Republic of Congo. Knight of the French Legion of Honour.



### PROF MARC GENTILINI

→ Emeritus Professor of Infectious and Tropical Diseases (Pitié-Salpêtrière, Paris), Marc Gentilini is

Honorary President of the Academy of Medicine and Honorary National President of the French Red Cross. He has served on France's Economic, Social and Environmental Council (CESE) and the National Consultative Commission on Human Rights (CNCDH). He is also general delegate for access to high-quality healthcare and medicine at the Fondation Chirac, including combating counterfeit medicines.



### MRS AICHA DIAKITÉ

→ President of the charity Solidarity for the Integration of Malian Albinos (SIAM) since 2009 and manager of the sunscreen

manufacturing unit in Mali in partnership with the National Disease Prevention Centre (CNAM) and the Fondation Pierre Fabre. Currently Head of Risks and Compliance in a financial institution, she holds a Master's degree in Applied Foreign Languages and Communication, with an option in Economic and Legal Sciences.



### DR LARAGH GOLLOGLY

→ Dr Laragh Gollogly, M.D., MPH, is Editor-in-Chief of the Bulletin of the World Health Organization, where she has been

working since 2004. Her earlier professional career included four years in London on the editorial staff of The Lancet. Her doctorate in medicine is from the University of Liège and she studied public health and tropical diseases at James Cook University in Australia.

### MR HERVÉ BERVILLE

→ MP for the Côtes-d'Armor since 2017, Hervé Berville is a member of the Foreign Affairs Committee and spokesperson for La République en Marche in the National Assembly. His was commissioned by the French President to draw up a report on modernisation of the partnerships and international solidarity policy, which was presented to the Prime Minister in August 2018. At the start of 2019, he was appointed rapporteur of the draft law relating to socially cohesive development and combating global inequality. A graduate of Sciences Po Lille and the London School of Economics, he previously worked as an economist for the French Development Agency as well as at the Institute for Innovation at Stanford University.



### MR MARWAN SEHNAOUI

→ Born in Beirut, graduate of EDC-Paris, with a Master's in Financial Management, he is currently Chairman of the Board of Directors of Luc Holding S.A.L. and Gras Savoye S.A.L. and Willis Towers Watson, as well as being a director of Michel Sehnaoui & Fils S.A.L. He is also very active in the non-profit sector. As a former member of the Board of Directors of the French-Lebanese Cultural Association, the Lebanese Equestrian Federation and the Lebanese national show-jumping team, he has led several missions to promote the French language. A Knight of Magistral Grace of the Sovereign Order of Malta, he is now President of the Lebanese Association of Knights of Malta and the Foundation of the Sovereign Order of Malta in Lebanon. His various actions have earned him a number of decorations. He has particularly been awarded the Grand Cross of Magistral Grace of the Sovereign Order of Malta with Cordon, is a Knight of the Legion of Honour, Knight of the Order of St Gregory the Great and Commander of the Order of the Cedar. Marwan Sehnaoui is married to the painter Mouna Bassili and father to two boys.



### MR JACQUES GODFRAIN

→ Jacques Godfrain is a graduate of the Institute of Political Studies in Toulouse and the Faculty of Law and Economics in Toulouse (1965). He also has a diploma of higher studies in economic sciences.

He began his career as an assistant manager at Snecma (1969-1970), before joining the French Air Transport Union (1970-1973 and 1974-1978).

After serving as a policy advisor to Georges Pompidou (1973-1974), he was deputy mayor of Saint-Affrique (1977-1995), MP (1978-1995 then 1997-2007), general councillor of the Aveyron (1979-1992) and then regional councillor of the Midi-Pyrénées (1992-1998). He was Minister of Cooperation from 1995 to 1997 and in 1995 he was elected mayor of Millau.

As part of his parliamentary work in the National Assembly, he was a member of the bureau for the RPR and UMP groups and parliamentary administrator and secretary of the Foreign Affairs Committee.

He has also been Honorary President of the Fondation Charles de Gaulle since 18 January 2011.

Finally, Jacques Godfrain is President of the France Volontaires association (responsible for promoting international volunteering), President of La Méridienne (responsible for tourism promotion for the A75 motorway and the Millau Viaduct), President of France Vétérinaire International and Honorary President of the French parliamentary rugby team.

He is also Treasurer of Fondation Pierre Fabre.



### MR MICHEL HAMALA SIDIBÉ

→ A graduate in economics, international development and social planning, Michel Hamala Sidibé is the new Malian Minister of Health and Social Affairs. He was appointed to this post following establishment of the broad-based government led by Dr Boubou Cissé. Having begun his career in the Timbuktu region, Mr Sidibé is an expert in the health sector and the world of NGOs.

In 1982, he became the Malian director of the NGO Fondation Terre des Hommes.

In 1987, he led an immunisation programme for the United Nations Children's Fund (Unicef) for the benefit of 30 million people in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In 2001, Michel Sidibé joined UNAIDS as Director of the Country and Regional Support Department. In 2007, he was appointed Deputy Executive Director of Programmes at UNAIDS and Assistant Secretary-General of the United Nations. Taking over from Péter Piot of Belgium, he was appointed Executive Director of UNAIDS.
